## IOSH Working Safely


In addition to IOSH Managing Safely, the Health and Safety Department is now accredited to teach IOSH Working Safely.

## Statutory Health Surveillance

Many people involved in research projects or other work at the University will come under a legal obligation, via COSHH risk assessment and by assessment of individual risk exposure, to participate in Health Surveillance - regular and appropriate procedures to detect and act upon any early signs of adverse work-related symptoms caused by hazard exposure.

The Occupational Health Unit provides appointments for this surveillance at their building in Drummond Street, and also by visiting many sites across the University for follow-up appointments.
